4:45 p.m. Arnold Schwarzenegger's private Gulfstream Jet pulls into the Three Bay Hangar in Mississauga. 5:00 At the Delta Chelsea Hotel downtown, guests sip California Merlot and Chardonnay as they wait for Mr. Schwarzenegger at a reception for the unveiling of Team Canada's new uni-forms for the Special Olympic. 5:05 Guest David Moran, a spokes-

man for Coca-Cola, which is a Special Olympics sponsor, ignores the wine and tips back a Coke. 5:39 Vic Rauter of TSN gets a call on

his cellphone while addressing the event attendees from a podium. "It's Vic Rauter. Have you arrived?" He flips his phone shut and speaks into the microphone: "They're here. That's pretty cool. got a call from the Governor.

5:53 Mr. Schwarzenegger takes the stage. He shakes hands with Emily Boycott, the event's co-emcee and a rhythmic gymnast. They are almost the same height with Ms. Boycott standing on a footstool at the podium. (Earlier, Ms. Boycott says the only movie that she's seen of his is Jingle All the Way. And only half of it.)

5:58 The Governor gives a shout-out to his mother-in-law, Eunice Kennedy Shriver, who founded the Special Olympics in 1968, "You always want to be on the good side of your mother-in-law," he says.

6:02 Mr. Schwarzenegger strips off his blazer, which is lined with the American and California flag. People start to shriek. He slips on the new Team Canada jacket, "Does it fit him?" a skep-tical guest says audibly over the whoops. The Governor does not zip it up.

6:09 Media briefing begins. Mr. Schwarzenegger answers four questions; he talks about hockey, the greatness of Canada, of Special Olympics and the importance of stem-cell research.

6:11 Briefing ends. They weren't kidding about the "brief" part.
6:25 A crowd waits for the Governor

outside of the hotel. Ellen Topping, a 58-year-old addictions counselor from Guelph, stands at the rope. "I've watched some of his movies but he's not my favourite," she says seriously. "All I know is he goes by the name of Terminator. I've probably seen it but I wouldn't remember it."

6:39 Mr. Schwarzenegger enters the LCBO on Queen's Quay.

6:43 He toasts to the successful sales of California wines. "It's delicious." After another sip: "Very nice." Salesmanship! 7.03 Inside the Dominion grocery store in Liberty Village, the governor poses with a bowl of California walnuts and then a bowl of cherries.

7:12 His cavalcade of dark-coloured SUVs pulls out of the parking lot and head to Liberty Grand Entertainment Complex for a reception dedicated to California innovation.

7:14 A man leaving the store doubts the governor's reported height of 6foot-2. "He's not that tall."
