
Election of John Tory puts end to scandal-plagued Ford administration

Failed federal NDP candidate in Trinity-Spadina Joe Cressy won Ward 20, defeating former mayoral candidate Sarah Thomson, and Christin Carmichael Greb won Ward 16 Eglinton-Lawrence, a riding most recently held by former mayoral candidate Karen Stintz. Former deputy mayor Doug Holyday's son Stephen Holyday was elected in his father's old riding of Ward 3 and longtime Liberal MP Jim Karygiannis won Ward 39, a position held in past by Mr. Ford's former budget chief Mike Del Grande. Mr. Tory, both a lawyer and a businessman, positioned himself as someone who would unify a council severely fractured during Mayor Ford's time in office — one that saw international late-night talk shows poke fun at the city's chief magistrate, who admitted to smoking crack, made graphic comments about his wife and a fellow mayoral

0:00 / 1:01 Largely identified as a centre-right alternative to Mr. Ford and to left-wing candidate Ms. Chow, Mr. Tory pledged to tackle traffic congestion with an \$8-billion aboveground transit line called SmartTrack and focus on bringing jobs to the city. Mr. Tory was also repeatedly attacked during the campaign as an "elitist" and out of touch with Torontonians' everyday experiences. In his concession speech, Doug Ford said he was proud of the Fords' "legacy" in office and of the six-week campaign.

Conservative party emerged the victor with 40% of the vote to Doug Ford's 34% — a result that was closer than anticipated after public opinion polls pegged Mr. Tory the clear winner for the past three months. Former NDP MP Olivia Chow trailed with 23%. It's a change in leadership that officially ends the scandal-plagued Ford administration and aims to begin an era of consensus-building at city hall. Mr. Tory indicated as much in his victory speech before a jubilant crowd at Liberty Grand Monday night, showered by a wave of blue, green and white balloons that dropped from the ceiling. candidate, was investigated by police and was stripped of many of his powers during his time in office. Only a cancer diagnosis would pull Rob Ford from the race, leaving his older brother Doug to leap in at the eleventh hour. Mr. Tory ran on a platform of uniting not just the council, but also multiple levels of government, with a focus on getting things done. Being elected mayor counts as a significant victory for Mr. Tory, who famously failed to bring the Ontario PCs to victory in 2007 after his campaign's promotion of faith-based school funding flopped and he lost his seat. He also ran for mayor in 2003 and lost to David Miller.
